| 1986 | After two years service in the Soviet Army he began to work as a master on »Krasnoe Sormovo« shipbuilding plant (specialized on building nuclear submarines) in the city of Nizhny Novgorod (former Gorky). In the end of 80's young leader Sergey Kirienko was elected secretary of regional Komsomol organization. After the end of Soviet Union Sergey Kirienko founded his own business. |
| 1993 – 1996 | Head of the Board of »Garantia« bank (Nizhny Novgorod). |
| 1996 – 1997 | President of NORSI-Oil Co. (Nizhny Novgorod). |
| May 1997 –
October 1997 | First deputy of fuel and energy minister of Russian Federation;
fuel and energy minister of Russian Federation. |
| April 1998 | Sergey Kirienko was appointed prime-minister of Russian Federation by the president Boris Yeltsin and worked in this quality until August 17. |
| 1999 | Became co-chairman and leader of political movement »Union of Right Forces«. December 19 was elected member of the third State Duma of the Federal Assembly of the Russian Federation. At the meeting of the »Union of Right Forces« faction was elected Head of the faction. |
| May 2000 | After the new president Vladimir Putin was elected, he appointed Sergey Kirienko his plenipotentiary in Volga Federal District (consists of 15 regions, six national republics included). At the same time he works as the Chairman of the State Commission on Chemical Weapons Destruction. |
| November 2005 –
December 2007 | Head of the Russian Federal Agency for Atomic Energy (Rosatom), after the presidential decree, head of the State Atomic Energy Corporation "Rosatom". |
